Reading Comprehension The wedding dress

In many countries, it is customary for the bride to wear a white dress as a symbol of her

innocence. The tradition of wearing a special white dress for the wedding ceremony started

over 150 years ago in 1840, when Queen Victoria married in white. Before that, brides wore all

The Rings

In many cultures, couple exchange rings, usually made of gold or silver, during the marriage ceremony. The circular shape of the ring is symbolic of the couple's **eternal** union. In Brazil, it is traditional to have the rings **engraved** with the bride's name on the groom's ring and **vice versa**. In the united States, England, Canada, and France, the wedding ring is usually worn on the third finger of the left hand because it was once believed that a vein ran directly from this finger to the heart. But wedding and engagement rings aren't always jewelry for the fingers. In traditional Hindu relationships, the man gives the woman a bichiya- a ring worn on the toe- as a symbol of their engagement.
